## **TURIN BAROQUE TOUR**

It tells of a brave bull that fought and killed a terrible snake that sowed terror among the inhabitants of the city, since the origins of his name "Augusta Taurinorum", the city of Turin delights and amazes its visitors.

With the Baroque time Turin reached the height of its glory through a consistent architectural language of great elegance.

On 17th March 1861 the first Italian Parliament proclaims Vittorio Emanuele The Second king of Italy and Turin will become the first Italian capital until 1865.

The great masterpieces of Baroque time are Palazzo Reale, Reggia di Venaria, Palazzo Madama, the house of Stupinigi, the Basilica di Superga.

The historical cafes are places of tradition and culture, to visit for unique antique furnishings and attend to experience the true atmosphere of Turin.

Turin is the home of chocolate, bread sticks and the famous chocolate Gianduiotto. You can enjoy a nice "bicerin", a typical hot drink of Turin created by the perfect and wise combination of coffee, chocolate and cream, already fashionable among the gentry at the end of eighteenth century.

## SPIRITUAL TURIN TOUR

Right here in Turin, Piazza Castello, the dome of the Cathedral of St. John of God conceived by Guarini holds the Shroud the most important symbol of Christianity in the world, precious relic exposition called a lot of people in Turin from all over the world, faithful believers or simply curious.

Indeed in 1576 the Holy Shroud, the cloth that may have wrapped the body of Christ in the tomb, was transferred from Chambery in Turin.

The city breathes the faith and the joy of union of souls in prayer and hope to find a truth not yet fully revealed. What is certain is that the synodic paths give wonder to the spirit in a city so full of mystery.

But Turin is also a communion of faith, multiethnic centre in Italy that collect faiths and religion in one heart.

## **INDUSTRIAL TURIN TOUR**

Le Corbusier called it "a cathedral of technology" the original Fiat factory of Lingotto.

Lingotto was built in 1926 by architect Giacomo Mattè Trucco, a giant cement of five floors, with a track for testing cars on the roof.

In 1988, Renzo Piano, who also designed the Beaubourg in Paris, began to transform the disused factory at Lingotto in a cultural and commercial center, a conference room on the roof, in a bubble of blue glass, an art gallery, an auditorium with 1900 seats and two high-tech hotels.

The industry has always held great importance in the capital of Piedmont, home of the car for the presence of the largest manufacturer company of cars in Italy and among the best known in the world, Fiat, has dedicated its cars a museum.

Inside you can admire the Isotta Franceschini headed by Gloria Swanson in the film Sunset Boulevard and Maserati and Mercedes of Manuel Fangio, an amazing collection, one of the largest in the world.
