

Mini Tour • Torino, Milano & shopping

Code D 018 – 3 days

1° day - Torino

Transfer to airport or train station and visit **Torino** and beginning with the world-famous Egyptian Museum, second in importance only to the one in Cairo. Lunch in restaurant. In the afternoon walk in the center city and visit Piazza Castello, The Royal Palace, the house of the Savoy King built in the 16th century, the Duomo, Piazza Vittorio and Piazza San Carlo. Free time for shopping at the famous fashion street Via Garibaldi. Back to the hotel, dinner and overnight.

2° day – Torino - Milano

Breakfast. Departure to **Venaria Reale** Palace to admire the fantastic place where the Savoy king Carlo Emanuele was born in 1658. The King build a hunting seat with project architect Amedeo di Castellamonte and later to Filippo Juvarra and Benedetto Alfieri. The Palace is one of the main Savoy residences, the internationally recognized so as to inspire the creators of the magnificent French palace of Versailles. The interior is filled with paintings and decorations arts of royal hunting. Lunch in restaurant. Depart from **Milan** and stop at the **Vicolungo Outlet**, a shopper's paradise, with designer names at bargain prices. Transfer to the hotel, dinner and overnight.

3° day - Milan

Breakfast. Visit the centre of Milan and the Castello Sforzesco, the ancient residence of the Visconti and Sforza families, now home to museums and temporary exhibitions and where,

among other masterpieces, you can admire the beautiful Pieta Rondanini, Michelangelo's last work.

A short walk leads to the impressive central square of the extraordinary Duomo, the largest and most complex Gothic building in Italy. The rich exterior, with more than 2000 statues, rises over 108 meters to the sky, its roof decorated with a “forest” of 135 spires, crowned by the famous gold Madonnina. Visit the Teatro La Scala, the “lyric Temple” and its museum. Pass through the Galleria Vittorio Emanuele, the city’s historic “drawing room” and then stroll along the elegant streets, like Via Montenapoleone, symbol of Milan’s reputation as the global capital of designer fashion. Free time for individual shopping, End of services.
